### I. Idea Generation and Contest Sign-Up

- You can work individually or with a group (max 6 in one group)
- Participants must sign-up for the contest with a deadline 15 November 2021. Your contest sign-up must include:
  1. CV of participant (s) and a passport size photo
  2. Details about the project:
    - The SDG goal that you are targeting
    - Description of your community/society
    - Why you have selected that specific SDG

### II. Project Submission

- Signed-up teams should submit their completed projects by a deadline 7th of December 2021.
- The full project should include the following details:
  1. Project Name / Team members names
  2. Project Description: what do you want to achieve and what is the issue you are trying to tackle?
  3. Project objectives: Projects aims, including information about how many people will benefit from your project.
  4. Impact on the economic, social, and environmental sustainability
  5. Potential benefits for the community/society
  6. What resources do you need? How do you plan to get them?
  7. Community Partners: Stakeholders
  8. Competitors: Is there any other organization in your community serving same SDG? Can you build partnership with them?
  9. Teamwork: Which skills do you need in your teamwork? Size of teamwork
  10. Funding – do you need money, and if so, how will you find it?
  11. How will you measure the impact of your project?
  12. SWOT analysis of your project
- Projects are to be submitted in word file (max 2000 words) + a PowerPoint presentation (20 slides max) / or video (duration max 10-15 minutes)

### III. Live Virtual Award Ceremony

- Results announcement 19th of December 2021
- Accepted full projects will be called to present their ideas at an international conference and the best presented projects will receive achievement award and a certificate.
